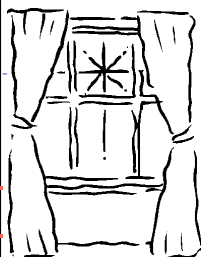

## Looking Out My Window, October 1, 2011

The British poet W. H. Auden and Nobel Prize for Literature winner became a Christian as an adult and joined the Church of England. Not long afterwards, he composed a long poem, "Christmas Oratorio." The closing lines read  
He is the Way;  
Follow Him through the Land of Unlikeness;  
You will see rare beasts, and have unique adventures.

He is the Truth.  
Seek Him in the Kingdom of Anxiety;  
You will come to a great city that has expected your return for years.

He is the Life.  
Love Him in the World of the Flesh;  
And, at your marriage all its occasions shall dance for joy.

[W. H. Auden, *Collected Poems*. Ed. Edward Mendelson. (New York: Vintage, 1991, p. 400.)

One can get the impression that a mystical or contemplative spirituality can only find expression in a monastery or in the life of a recluse uninvolved in the myriad demands of daily life. But, Auden's poetry points us in exactly the opposite direction. We are to follow Christ "through the Land of Unlikeness," seek Christ in "the Kingdom of

Anxiety," and love Christ in the "World of the Flesh."

When your life space seems estranged from worship and prayer, there, in that "Land of Unlikeness," Christ is there seeking to lead us. When life's demands feel like "the Kingdom of Anxiety," Christ is present inviting us to find him. When our existence seems overcome with the values and desires of a secular existence, "The World of the Flesh," we will find Christ's presence in that very place inviting and invoking our love.

Christ combined a devotion to withdrawal, prayer and union with God with a busy and fully engaged life. So much of his existence unfolded in "The Land of Unlikeness." His wrestling in the Garden on his last night was one of many visits to "The Kingdom of Anxiety." And, he himself was the Word made flesh (John 1:14). He loved God in "The World of the Flesh."

### Missio Engage

In the September vestry meeting, the vestry voted to participate in a national church initiative called Missio Engage. We will be one of twenty parishes in the national church with a team receiving training in evangelism and church development over a two-year period. The web-based training sessions are led by Episcopal clergy with experience in church planting and redevelopment of existing churches.

The twenty churches involved form a community of practice. They will be sharing not only with the coaches doing the training but with one another throughout the process. (See this web site for an introduction to the community of practice concept--<http://www.ewenger.com/theory>)

Our local team is taking shape and once that team has formed, you will be asked to pray for them regularly.

## KAIROS

### *Changing Hearts\*\*Transforming Lives\*\*Impacting the World*

He came to the open mike that Saturday night to tell what he thought of this Kairos weekend. You could tell by his look that he was a young man used to trouble. He was about 21 and marked by the signs of the Aryan prison gangs, tattoos on his hands, arms, neck and face.

He took his turn and in a surprisingly mild voice said, "When I came to Kairos I had no hope. I am doing two life sentences and the only thing I had is this life was drugs. I had never seen the love that these men have shown me and the love that Christ brings. I now have hope."

In his story he told his table "family" that while on drugs he had murdered his father, a Baptist preacher and another family member. He had no one and no hope!

He had not encountered the Christ as shown in the Kairos agape love. He had not yet met Mac Hall or Fr. Chuck or Fr. Matthew or Dennis Endicott.

He was at a family table with five other prisoners, a priest and two volunteers. These "free world" men had met and prayed and trained together for three months to prepare for this weekend encounter with Christ, the Holy Spirit and these men we had never known.

As a family they listened to a series of talks and meditations, sang much music and ate their fill of cookies and good food. They prayed together and for each other, most had never had someone pray for them and especially never prayed for someone else. They did art work and shared ideas that were listened to and given credit and respect.

They were shown the love of Christ and told of forgiveness. They committed the names of those whom they had wronged and had wronged them to a secret list, which was burned in a forgiveness ceremony.

Having learned that sin can be forgiven and that heaven waits on those who love Christ, our young man had his Christian friend Mac Hall set him up with our Chapel priest Fr. Matthew. He spent an hour in prayer, conversation and I am sure confession and absolution. He now had hope.

Kairos is a ministry to prisoners in maximum and medium security facilities. It is modeled after the Cursillo movement and that short course in Christianity. We are advocates for Christ, not for prisoners or prison reform. We want to spread Christianity through the prison by forming small "prayer and share" groups (reunion groups). We do not preach or require the acceptance of any dogma. Our motto is Listen, Listen, Love, Love. Christ and the Holy Spirit will provide the rest.

Kairos is a volunteer organization funded by donations raised by the team. It has many opportunities for volunteers! Some people pray in prayer chains or by using "prayer hands". Some bake homemade cookies (we eat 600 doz in 3 days). Some prepare the meals eaten by the men and team and others carry these and other supplies to prison. Some join the team, tell their story of a journey with Christ, witness, do the weekend and one year of monthly visits to the prisoners. Some give money to pay for the ministry.

Read Matthew 25:31-45

Holy Comforter has been involved with Kairos for nearly 30 years. Gene Giles and Bishop Stough brought the ministry to Alabama.

Another day we will talk about Kairos Outside (Ministry to female loved ones of the incarcerated) and Kairos Torch (A mentoring ministry to juvenile offenders and children of the incarcerated).

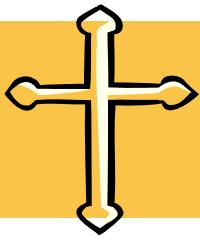


### FAMILY PROMISE

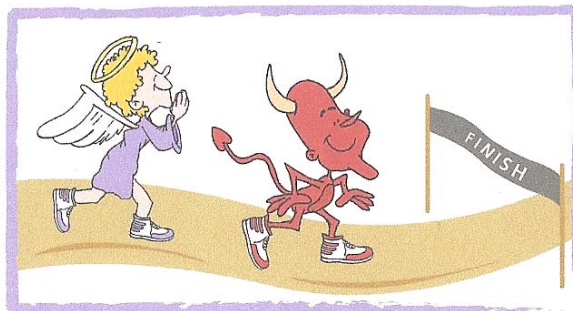

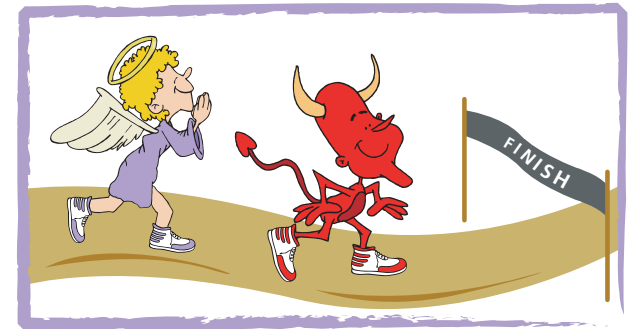

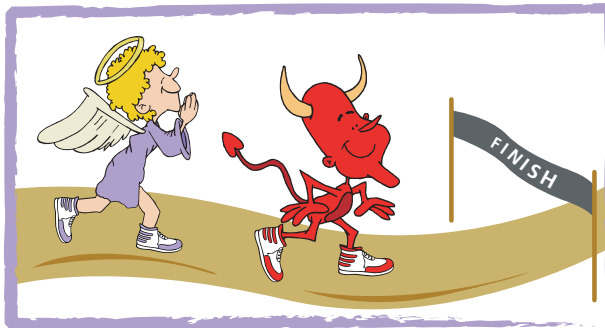
