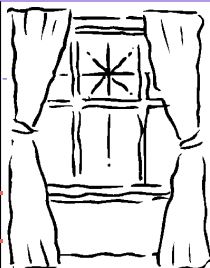

## Looking Out My Window November 1, 2011

I often wonder what you are thinking as you approach the rail on Sunday to receive Holy Communion. Do you wonder what I am thinking?

I often experience an overpowering stream of consciousness during Communion; sometimes that consciousness has this as one of its pieces as I serve the bread, “The body of Christ consecrated by YOUR prayer.”

Does that surprise you or sound strange? A question asked me in Louisiana brought this issue into focus for me as a new priest. A woman reared in the Roman Catholic tradition shared with me that a priest once criticized her after Eucharist. He saw her lips moving as she silently followed along while he offered the Great Thanksgiving; he told her that was inappropriate with words something like, “That is MY prayer as priest.”

My immediate response to her was to refer her to the prayers in The Book of Common Prayer, prayers I knew were worded very much like those in the altar book of her church. All the pronouns, I said, are in the plural- “We, our.” Her face broke into a smile, and she went away reassured that the Great Thanksgiving is the church’s prayer, not just the priest’s prayer.

All the prayers in both rites in The Book of Common Prayer use plural pro-

nouns. Remember with me some of the phrases in Prayer A of Rite 2: “Therefore, WE praise you . . .”; “You made US for yourself . . .”; “WE proclaim the mystery of faith . . .”; “WE celebrate the memorial of OUR redemption . . .”; “WE offer you these gifts . . .”; “All this WE ask through your Son Jesus Christ. . . .” (Capitalization of pronouns is mine for emphasis.)

When you receive the bread and hear the words “The body of Christ, the bread of heaven,” remember that you are not a passive spectator. The priest has given voice to the common prayer of the people. In response to your prayers, joined with the common prayer of the whole church, Christ has come and made holy the bread and wine with his presence, and you as well.

If I see your lips moving silently during the Great Thanksgiving, my heart will be glad, because you will be joining in a prayer intended for all of us to offer together.

- ❖ Go out Vaughn Road approximately 9 miles beyond the intersection of Taylor and Vaughn Roads.
- ❖ At the nine mile marker, look for County Road 083 sign. At this point, Wallahatchee Road forks with Vaughn Road.
- ❖ Vaughn Road will veer left sharply; continue straight onto Wallahatchee Road/083. (Woodland United Methodist Church will be on your left.) Go about one mile on Wallahatchee Road. Turn at the second mailbox on the left (across from a sign that reads The Mane Idea.) Look for the balloons tied on the mailbox!

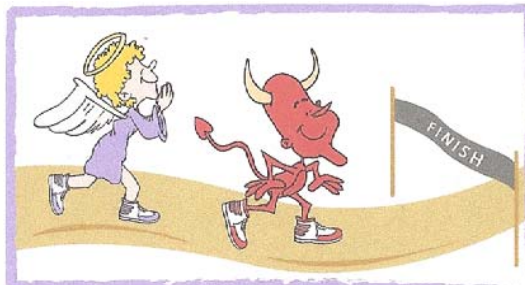


### Quarterly Statements Have Been Mailed

# Vestry Elections—Sunday, November 13, 2011

## Nomination deadline—Friday, November 4, 2011

### Vestry Elections Nomination Form

#### GUIDELINES FOR VESTRY ELECTIONS:

1. The Vestry of the Church of the Holy Comforter shall consist of nine members, three of whom will be elected at the annual meeting. The new Vestry members will serve a term of three years beginning in January after the election.
2. No member may be elected to the Vestry for consecutive three-year terms.
3. One of the three newly elected members must never have served on the Vestry of The Church of the Holy Comforter, Montgomery.
4. To be accepted for nomination a member must be an **adult confirmed communicant in good standing** who is known to the Rector and treasurer. **Known to the treasurer:** means that you are a pledging member. **Confirmed:** Any baptized person who received the laying on of hands at Confirmation (by any Bishop in apostolic succession) or is received into the Episcopal Church by a Bishop of this Church is to be considered, for the purpose of this and all other Canons, as both baptized and confirmed. I.17.1 (d)

#### **Communicant:**

(a) All members of this Church who have received Holy Communion in this Church at least three times during the preceding year are to be considered communicants of this Church. I.17.2 (a)

(b) Adult: For the purposes of statistical consistency throughout the Church, communicants sixteen years of age and over are to be considered adult communicants. I.17.2 (b)

**Communicant in good standing:** All communicants of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered communicants in good standing. I.17.3

5. A majority vote of a quorum of communicants in good standing is required for election to the Vestry.
6. In the event of an unplanned vacancy on the Vestry, the remaining members may elect a successor by majority vote to fill the term until the next Vestry election.
7. Outgoing members of the Vestry shall comprise the nominating committee for new Vestry members. ***This year's outgoing members are: Leanne Barber, Dennis Gibson, Rose Lollar, Nelya McKenzie.***
8. Nominations **MUST** be made on **this** nomination form to any member of the nominating committee or the Rector.
